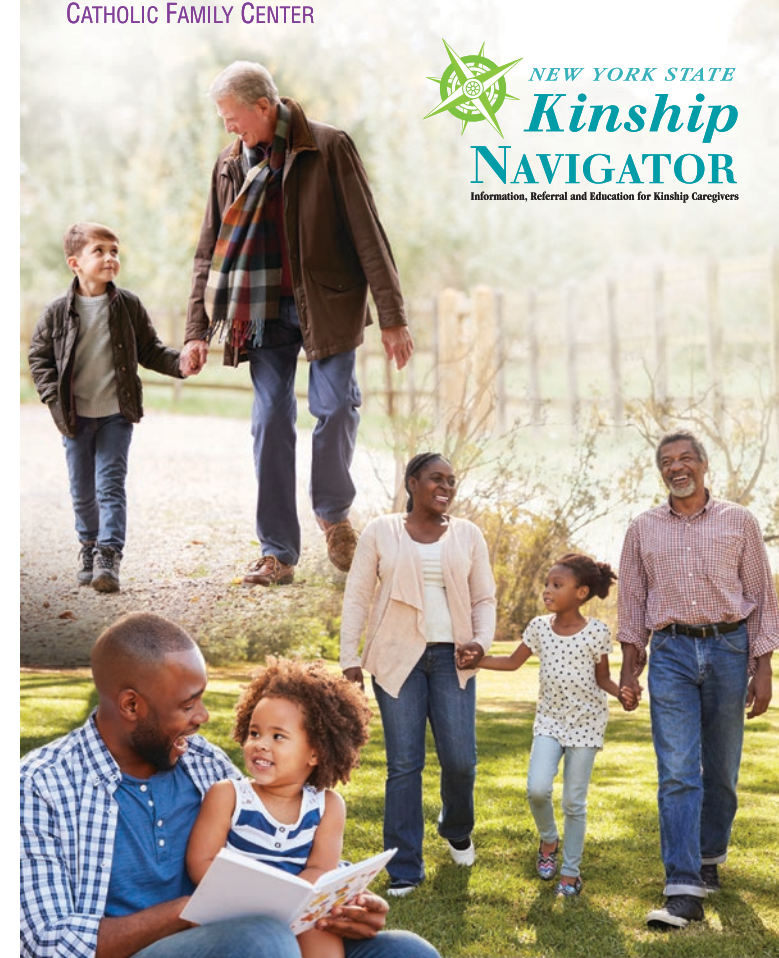

- Informing on state and federal laws.
- Assisting with applying for Public Benefits.
- Providing access to local kinship resources and assistance.

### Professional Assistance

Our Kinship Navigators provide individualized information:

- Access to kinship professionals.
- Attorneys specializing in Family Court.
- Experts on public assistance, social security and education law.
- Local collaborations via Permission to Contact Procedure, providing a referral from department child welfare and public assistance staff to Kinship Navigator.
