WHEREAS, a Project CR 10 over the Poultney River PIN 1757.25 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs such program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal funds and 20% non Federal Funds, and

WHEREAS, the County of Washington desires to advance the Project by making a commitment of 100% of the non-federal share of the costs of Design and ROW Acquisition and Construction, Construction Inspection; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the County Board of Supervisors hereby approves the above-subject project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes Washington County to pay in the first instance 100% of the federal and non-federal share of the cost of Design and ROW Acquisition and Construction, Construction Inspection work for the Project or portions thereof; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$908,864.00 has been appropriated and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phase of the Project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the additional sum of \$120,000.00 is hereby appropriated and made available to cover the cost of participation in the above phases of the project; and be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event the full federal and non-federal share costs of the project exceeds the amount appropriated above, the Washington County Board of Supervisors shall convene as soon as possible to appropriate said excess amount immediately upon the notification by the New York State Department of Transportation thereof; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the County Board of Supervisors Chairman be and is hereby authorized to execute all necessary agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for Federal Aid and/or Marchiselli Aid on behalf of the County of Washington with the New York State Department of Transportation in connection with the advancement or approval of the Project and providing for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid and state-aid eligible Project costs and all Project costs within appropriations therefore that are not so eligible; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be filed with the New York State Commissioner of Transportation by attaching it to any necessary Agreement in connection with the Project; and be it further

RESOLVED, this Resolution shall take effect immediately.

BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT: Costs shared as indicated above. Joint project with Vermont. Project funded 80% federal aid and 20% state aid with no local share.

TITLE: Authorizing and Approving a Settlement to an Action Relating to the Opioid Crisis (McKesson, Cardinal Health et al.)

WHEREAS, there is pending the matter of County of Suffolk v. Purdue Pharma L.P., et al., under Index No. 400001/2017 in the Supreme Court, Suffolk County, regarding the opioid addiction crisis, in which the County of Washington is the named plaintiff in the action (the “Action”), and

WHEREAS, the Action is against several defendants, including manufacturers of opioids, distributors of opioids and chain pharmacies, and

WHEREAS, the Action alleges several causes of action against defendants McKesson Corporation, Cardinal Health, Inc., AmerisourceBergen Drug Corporation, PSS World Medical, Inc., Kinray, LLC, Bellco Drug Corporation, and American Medical Distributors, Inc. (the “Distributors”) based on claims that the Distributors contributed to the opioid epidemic by failing to comply with their obligations under the federal Controlled Substances Act and the New York Controlled Substances Act to implement adequate measures to prevent diversion of the prescription opioids they distributed to pharmacies and others in Washington, all of which contributed to a public health crisis in Washington County, and

WHEREAS, the Distributors have offered to settle the County of Washington’s claims against them by paying the sum of between approximately \$712,919.20 and \$1,259,361.55 over eighteen (18) years and agreeing to implement injunctive relief under a controlled substance monitoring program; and

WHEREAS, the County Attorney’s Office has approved a settlement agreement and release (“Agreement”) and the Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit “A”, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County of Washington to resolve this matter with respect to the Distributors without further litigation and enter into the proposed Agreement as it shall settle all allegations against the Distributors and avoid protracted litigation; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the execution and delivery on behalf of and in the name of the County of Washington by the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, or his designee, of the proposed Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit “A” is hereby authorized, and the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, or his designee, is hereby authorized, subject to County Attorney approval, and directed to execute the proposed Agreement in a form substantially similar thereto and execute such other documents as may be necessary and appropriate to effectuate the settlement with the Distributors; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature, being the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) Lead Agency, hereby finds and determines that the adoption of this resolution constitutes a Type II Action pursuant to Section 617.5(c)(26) and (33) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS (6NYCRR) and within the meaning of Section 8-0109(2) of the NEW YORK ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW as a promulgation of regulations, rules, policies, procedures, and legislative decisions in connection with continuing agency administration, management, and information collections, and the Clerk of the Washington County Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.

BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT: This will provide a settlement for one party in the County’s opioid suit in the range specified. Parts of the sums indicated are restricted for use in opioid related issues.

WHEREAS, the Personnel Committee also recommends establishing these positions in Public Health's staffing pattern; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that Public Health's staffing pattern be amended to add six (6) Fellows, one (1) Graduate Fellow and one (1) Local Coordinator.

WHEREAS, the County of Washington is currently responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the pipeline, and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 175 of 2021, the County conveyed its pipeline easements across the lands of others, together with the associated rights and obligations and associated maintenance thereof, to Washington Land Associates, LLC, and

WHEREAS, the County of Washington desires to now provide an Easement for the portion of said pipeline that crosses County owned land, and the associated rights and obligations, to Washington Land Associates LLC for One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration, and

WHEREAS, the County of Washington deems this conveyance to be in the best interest of the citizens of the County of Washington; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that:

1. The Board of Supervisors of the County of Washington, Washington County, New York hereby authorizes the provision of a pipeline Easement in its current location across its property, together with the associated rights and obligations to enter and maintain said pipeline, as set forth above, to the Washington Land Associates LLC.
2. The specific object or purpose for this easement is to ensure that Washington Land Associates, LLC, its successors and assigns be responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of such pipeline and to release Washington County from any and all responsibility and liability for the same.
3. The Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to execute all transfer documents required to effectuate the purpose of this resolution, in a form approved by the County Attorney.

TITLE: Support Adirondack Community College Capital Improvement Plan for 2022-2023 in the Total Amount of \$1,701,500

WHEREAS, the need for improvements to the College's facilities is necessary to provide an improved learning environment, necessary repairs to old equipment, purchases of new equipment, upgrades to existing facilities which have deteriorated, and

WHEREAS, the following capital needs are required for the Campus:

WHEREAS, the total cost of the above capital needs projects is One Million Seven Hundred One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars and no/100 (\$1,701,500), of which Fifty percent (50%) will be funded by the State of New York and the remaining Fifty percent (50%) is funded by the Sponsors, and

WHEREAS, the Sponsor share in the amount of Eight Hundred Fifty Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars and no/100 (\$850,750) shall be borne by the capital chargebacks collected by the College and/or other resources, including donations the College may receive; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Washington County Board of Supervisors authorizes the above capital projects; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Sponsor's share of the cost of the projects of \$1,701,500 shall be paid from the accumulated capital chargeback funds and/or other resources.

BUDGET IMPACT STATEMENT: The local share will be paid by capital chargeback funds received from students attending ACC who reside outside of the sponsor counties.
